Winter semester

- Nomination deadline (for partners): 15 June
- Application deadline (for students): 15 July

Summer semester

- Nomination deadline (for partners): 15 December
- Application deadline (for students): 15 January

Nomination and Application Process

Students have to be nominated by their home university. This can be done via EWP which we are currently implementing with a trial period.

We also accept nominations via e-mail to incoming@rh-koeln.de. Please include the student's **first name and surname, date of birth, gender, e-mail address, field of study and the study level (BA/MA)** (template nomination sheet available on our [website](#)). We will then contact your students for their enrolment at RH Köln.

To finalize the application process, students must return any required documents and formally enrol at RH Köln, see "Enrolment".

Enrolment

Enrolment Procedure

While incoming students may select courses from different study programs, they are enrolled in the degree program from which they have chosen the most courses.

Incoming students are informed on which steps need to be taken throughout the formal enrolment process by the student advisory service. They can be contacted under studienberatung@rh-koeln.de.

Health Insurance

In Germany, all students must provide proof of their health insurance in the enrolment process. The insurance obligation can be covered by an insurance in their home country or by a German health insurance. Students will be asked for proof of their insurance status during the enrolment process.

Fees

Erasmus+ students do not need to pay any tuition fees. However, the social contribution AStA fee is deducted via direct debit after enrolment. It includes the costs for the services of the Student Committee and for public transportation within Germany (Deutschlandticket).

Visa

Applicants from most Non-EU countries must obtain a student visa at the German embassy or consulate in their native country before travelling to Germany. Please note: It can take several weeks or months to process a visa application!
